WHO WE ARE:

We are the Beil family, working with CORE Missions as church planting missionaries to Latin America.

Our goal is to partner with foreign missionaries; to help them train, equip, and assist national pastors, enabling them to plant churches in remote places.

For the last seven years we have been involved in the planting of two churches in America. We believe God has gifted us, grown us, and given us much needed church planting experience. During that time, we were also able to take mission trips to Ghana, Germany, Honduras, Haiti, Cuba, Jamaica and the Philippines. We now believe God is calling us full-time to the foreign field. These trips helped to confirm that call.

We are in need of churches to partner with us in prayer and financial support so we can do this work on a full time basis. We are praying for God to guide us to the right partners. We would be honored if you would prayerfully consider making us a part of your missions program. We are currently at 86% of our needed support.

WHY WE GO

To glorify God by preaching His gospel to the nations.

The ultimate purpose for man's existence is to glorify God (Romans 11:6). We need to preach the Gospel not just out of a love for the lost in this world, but out of our love for God. We go to see Him glorified by those of "all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues" (Revelation 7:9).

The greatest good that we as believers can accomplish for humanity is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ to all the world. When people are reconciled to God, they become reconciled to one another. The gospel is the message through which people come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, and it is also the means by which they grow and become more like Jesus. Paul tells us "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth..." (Romans 1:16)

The gospel not only takes place in the salvation of a sinner but in their sanctification as a believer (I Timothy 3:16). The more a believer understands what God did for us in Christ, the more godly, Christlike, and conscious of the lost in the world he will be.

To establish Biblical churches.

We believe that the local church is the means by which the gospel is proclaimed to the world. It is the place where saved and baptized believers of Jesus Christ gather together to worship, pray, study the Word, obey the two ordinances (baptism and Lord's Supper), and evangelize the world through the preaching of the gospel.

A church was the goal of the apostles (Ephesians 3:10-11,21; 4:11-13), and it continues to be the goal of missions work today.

The Great Commission is not a ministry option to be debated by the church; it is a direct command from the Lord Himself (Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-48; John 20:21; Acts 1:8)

We can learn from Paul in this regard. His passion, responsibility, and burden for preaching the gospel to the lost should encourage and convict us to do the same today. It is our responsibility in this generation to take the gospel to all the world using our time, talents, and treasure.

OUR MISSIONS PHILOSOPHY

The New Testament pattern validates the planting of churches through the work of training local leaders who will faithfully reproduce themselves.



II Timothy 2:2

"And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

From this verse of Scripture we draw our pattern for church planting. In this one verse of Scripture we find four examples of spiritual leaders taking their faith and passing it on to the next generation. Just as Paul invested and trained Timothy, he is also instructing him to pass those same truths of God on to faithful men, so they can teach and train more leaders.

The adjective "indigenous" [from the Latin word indigena = native] denotes a

person or thing that originates or is identified with a specific geographic location, people group, or culture.

There is still a great need for American missionaries to go to unevangelized parts of the world. Once a church planting movement has begun, we must do all we can to pass the baton to local pastors and leaders.

We seek to work with missionaries of like faith, indigenous congregations, and pastors in the Latin American world. Our goal is to help them evangelize, disciple, and establish churches among their own people.

WHERE WE START

Approximately the first two years on the mission field are often called the learning or adaptation period. Missionaries are usually learning to live and learning to adapt to a new culture.



We will be spending our first two year term in Chile attempting to learn these four things:

- 1. To become fully fluent in Spanish through language training. (including grammar)
- 2. To understand the culture of the people living in Latin America.
- 3. To form personal relationships and begin discipling Chileans.
- 4. To learn and develop models of church planting that will be most effective in Latin America.

We will be working with and learning from veteran missionaries Jason and Lori Holt. They have spent 17 years in Santiago, Chile. They have been able to plant churches, reach Chileans and train many of them for ministry. They also started and oversee the Seminario Chileno Bautista, a college for training men and women for ministry. Our first year will be focused on language training during the week, and on the weekend assisting the Holt's in a new church plant. Our second year plan is to go with a young national pastor and his family and help them plant a church.
